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It accords with what we have said on the first point, that God should love the human nature assumed by his Word in the person of Christ more than all the angels. This veiling in metaphors is useful for stimulating the thoughtful, and useful also against unbelievers, of whom it is said in Matt.

We see how some things, like natural bodies, work for an end even though they have. Hence anything whose existence is different from its essence must be caused by something other than. Anything which is changeable and subject to defect must depend on some first principle which is immovable and necessary in itself, as we have shown. We know them through their likenesses which exist in us.

This common ascription is midway between merely equivocal and purely univocal. I sought to reconcile the philosophy of Aristotle with the principles of Christianity, avoiding the pantheism which it seemed to imply cf.
